Isaiah 50:4-9a The speaker in this third servant song affirms the sure presence of God in the midst of cruel and unjust treatment. Despite being insulted, spit upon, and physically struck, this faithful believer declares that God "who declared me innocent is near" (50:8).

Philippians 2:5-11 This ancient hymn gives witness both to the faithfulness of Christ, and to the faithfulness of God. Jesus is the suffering servant whom God vindicates.
