### Other Lectionary readings for the day

Psalm 78:1-7 The psalmist's song prods the people to remember God's mighty acts and to share them with the generations to follow, so that every generation will set their hope on God.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Paul describes the second coming of Jesus for those who are alive as a way to help them cope with the death of others. He tells them to let his words encourage them.

Matthew 25:1-13 The parable of the ten bridesmaids is a cautionary tale about being ready for an anticipated arrival of the Bridegroom, but one whose date is not announced. The parable calls believers to be alert and ready.
