Other Lectionary readings for the day

Jonah 3;1-5,10 When Jonah flees on a ship from the Lord's command, God sends a storm and reveals the reason to the frightened sailors.

Psalm 62:5-12 Hope and salvation are from God, "my strong rock' (v7), who is worthy of trust. High or low estate or riches do not matter. Power and steadfast love belong to God.

1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Paul's followers are to treat their worldly states of marriage, mourning, rejoicing, or doing business as though that was not their state for the 'time has drawn short" (v29) and "this world in its present form is passing away" (v31).
