#### **Other Lectionary readings for the day**

**Job 23 1:9, 16-17** Job seeks God to present his complaint, believing that God will not crush him with great power. Ambiguity in the Hebrew allows for the interpretation that, even in the seeming absence of God, Job is not entirely defeated.

**Psalms 22:1-15** This psalm, echoed by Christ on the Cross, lays bare the agony of human suffering and shows trust in the midst of adversity as the psalmist reaches out to God.

**Hebrews 4:12-16** Although God's word exposes our short comings, through Jesus, our sympathetic high priest, we can approach God boldly and find grace in times of need.
