Precis of AAM

‘Flesh’ refers to our anatomical body – skin, blood and bones – our physical being.

‘Word’ – could be talking about our communication, Listening, writing, reading, singing and how we describe and talk about things.

The Bible is referred to as The Word – words that tell us about God; Jesus is referred to as The Word – the ‘flesh that tells us and shows us how to live in the world in a way that God would be revealed.
