**Psalms 1** Provides a paradigmatic example of those who both embody God’s word (Torah) and are formed by it within the community of God’s people. People who embrace Torah find it brings burgeoning life.

### **1 Corinthians 15:12-20**

A passage related to the Resurrection – Christ being raised from the dead is our basis for preaching and believing. Our hope in Christ goes beyond this life.
