Lectionary readings for the day

Deuteronomy 26:1-11 Instructions for the offering of the first fruits. Verse 1 is a reminder at the outset of the abundance of God that engulfs us. Having been given such a great gift (land, salvation) we first offer back to God.

Psalm 91:1-2, 9-16 The psalmist sings to God the protector. Dwelling in God's land means refuge from evil, and safety in the midst of danger.

Romans 10:8b-13 Calling on the name of the Lord means salvation. There is power to confessing with our lips, to calling on God. Speaking this truth somehow manifests its reality.
