Lectionary readings for the day

Acts 16:9-15 Paul grasps that the gospel is not meant not just for Semitic people but for Other Mediterranean peoples as well.

Psalm 67 The intention is for all people to revere God: "Let the people celebrate and shout With joy because you judge the nations fairly and guide all nations on the earth" (Vs.4). **Revelation 21:10, 22 -22:5** The tree of life in the New Jerusalem will be replenished by the water of God's life flowing from the throne; God's purpose is realised in the healing of all the nations.

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All Age Message: "Lydia – God plants seeds in our hearts"
