Lectionary readings for the day

Isaiah 5: 1-7 The opening message of the prophet Isaiah is quite clear: God is most angry. While holding out the possibility of forgiveness, God sees a people whose violent and unjust actions give the lie to their empty worship.

Hebrews 11: 29-12: 2 What does it mean to live by faith? After presenting us with a definition of faith – things hoped for but not seen – the author presents us with portraits of those who lived faithful lives. They stepped out in faith but did not see the promise fulfilled. **Psalm 80:1-2, 8-18** God, the mighty one, is our judge, and no other. And it is God who testifies against us.
