Discussion Starters

- 1. What do you think about the idea that a teenager could be the chosen voice of God?
- 2. How do you deal with difficulties on your walk of faith? How do you listen to what god might be saying to you at such a time?
- 3. Think of a challenge that faces your church or faith community. How might you work together to discern what God is calling you to do?
- 4. Jeremiah was called to speak to all in the public arena. How do you make your voice heard about the important issues today?

Lectionary readings for the day

Luke13:10-17 On a Sabbath, Jesus liberates a woman from eighteen years of being bent over under Satan's bondage. When others protest, Jesus calls them to recognise that God was working to set free a daughter of Abraham.

Hebrews 12: 18-29 The author reminds listeners that they have access to Mount Zion, the presence of the living God and to Jesus, mediator of a new covenant.

Psalm 71:1-6 The psalmist prays for refuge and protection, praising God who has been with him from his mother's womb.
