Discussion Starters

- 3. Think about your church space. Is it accessible and welcoming? Does anything need to change?
- 4. How do you think this teaching from Jesus can help your church reach out into the wider community?

Lectionary readings for the day

Jeremiah 2:4-13 After bringing Israel to a new land to eat its fruits, God finds that all have turned away, even the kings, lawyers, priests, and prophets. They have replaced God, the living water, with leaky cisterns.

Psalm 81:1, 10-16 God laments Israel's refusal to listen and walk in his ways. Even so, God offers to feed them with wheat and honey.

Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16 The Christian community is to be a living sacrifice of praise, revealed in lives of mutual love, hospitality, and care, especially for those usually excluded.
