Lectionary readings for the day

Jeremiah 14:11-12 A sirocco signals God's judgement on people whose evil has produced a land that is desolate, barren, and lifeless. Creation is rolled back: the heavens have no light. Psalm 14 The psalmist sings a song of sorrow, lamenting human corruption and alienation from God. Yet, lament yields to hope for God's deliverance and the restoration of Israel's fortunes.

Timothy 1: 12-17 Paul voices his basic Kerygma and personal witness: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"- and I'm the biggest sinner of all" (v16), proclaiming God's mercy and grace in Christ.
