Psalm 145:1-5. 17-21 The psalmist praises the works of God that are witnessed throughout the generations and gives thanks for God's continuing presence.

2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17 In the midst of persecution the people are reminded of God's continuing presence through Jesus Christ. Comfort comes in the presence of God.
