- 4** Where in your community is Christ’s rule apparent, or conversely why does the community see Christ’s rule is irrelevant?

Psalm 100 All the earth is summoned to give thanks and remember that they belong to God, the great shepherd who is also the great creator. They are called to acknowledge God’s goodness, steadfast love and faithfulness, to every generation.

Ephesians 1:15-23 Paul gives thanks for the believers in Ephesus and commends them for their love for all the saints. He prays for their wisdom, for their inheritance, and for God’s power to work in them as it did in Christ when he was resurrected.
