Lectionary readings for the day

Jeremiah 31:31-34 The theme of the new covenant, something that replaces law-keeping, occurs in this text as in the Gospel text. God will forgive sin and not even remember it and a new relation of heart-deep knowing will come.

Psalm 51:1-12 The psalmist is unable to escape the memory and reality of sin. The psalmist longs for restoration in body and spirit: restore joy, create a clean heart, sustain with a willing spirit. Both remorse and forgiveness are visceral: Even the body longs to rejoice again.

Hebrews 5:5-10 Jesus, the divine appointed and fully human priest on behalf of all suffers. Suffering, praying, and learning through obedience are surely no less crucial in our own formation.
