Lectionary readings for the day

Psalm 4 The psalmist laments "how long" the unbelieving delusions of the people will last while urging the people to "know this: the LORD takes personal care of the faithful" (v3). **Acts 4:32-35** The people neither understood nor believed the scriptures about the coming of Jesus. But God used this ignorance to reveal everything he foretold about the coming of the Christ.

1 John 3: 1-7 John comforts the Christians of his day who are struggling with the unbelieving world by assuring them the reason that the world does not accept them is that the world also neither knew nor accepted the Christ.
