Lectionary readings for the day

Psalm 98 God moves to restore righteous order in creation. In repose the psalmist calls the earth to rejoice, first in Israel, then in the rest of the nations, and finally throughout all creation.

Acts 10:44-48 God pours out the Spirit on the household of Cornelius in Caesarea, surprising Peter and his associates and prompting them to glossolalia and praise. In this passage God interrupts Peter's preaching with his outpouring.

1 John **5:1-6** God births children of faith through Jesus and causes them to overcome the world. In birth the child is a passive recipient of life from the parents, as are children born of God.
