Discussion Starters

1. Did you hear anything in today's message which was new? Or presented differently to how you have understood things previously?
2. Does reflecting on interconnectedness of the trinity change how you see your relationship with God? Especially in light of God taking His Humanity into relationship with the Trinity.
3. How do we nurture and support each other as Christians in unity with God and each other, not just on Sundays, but throughout the week?
4. How do we see God at work in our community regarding the theme of the message?

Readings for this day

Proverbs 8:1-4 Wisdom is personified and portrayed as a living creation of YHWH. We are first called to listen to Wisdom and then given the reason.

Psalms 8 Directs us to the work of creation, to its grandeur and beauty, and to comparative smallness of humanity. Yet God has given humanity something special that even so sets us apart.

Romans 5:1-5 A classic Trinitarian text, shows us the 3 divine Persons working in concert to make us new creations justified by grace and engulfed by the anointing of God's love.
