Discussion Starters

- 1 Which character do you most connect with in the story? Why?
- 2 The sermon suggests that we often fall short of being the "Good Samaritan." How does this idea of "falling short" resonate with your own experiences?
- 3 Sometimes we are the "man in the ditch." How might acknowledging our own vulnerability change how we approach acts of service and compassion?
- 4 The lawyer asks, "And who is my neighbour?" a loophole, or limit who we are obligated to help. Who are the invisible neighbours for our church?

Amos 7:7-17 Called by God, Amos has gone from herding sheep to Challenging Jeroboam and the people of Israel. With a plumbline God finds the nation warped.

Psalm 82 God confronts the nations with their sins and misdeeds. The poor a have been ignored and the wealthy favoured. They are told to give justice to the weak and orphans and rescue the needy.

Colossians 1:1-14 Paul praises the saints in Colossae for their faithfulness and love of God. He prays they be strong to endue challenges that may come.
