### **Readings for this day**

**Amos 8:1-**12God shows Amos a basket of summer fruit as a visual image of the Irael's end. The people have ignored God and oppressed the poor and needy. A famine of God's word is eminent.

**Psalm 52** The psalmist reminds the wicked who are trusting only their wealth, their lying, and their love of evil that they will be subject to God's judgement. Trust should be in God.

**Colossians 1:15-24** All we know comes through Christ who has shown us God. Central to this is forgiveness and reconciliation through the 'blood of the cross'.

#### Precis of AAM
