- **Discussion Starters**
- 1 Do you often use the Lord's Prayer in your own life? How has it shown up?
- 2 "Prayer only comes alive when we experience deepened, and a deep sense of God's unconditional love." Have you ever felt your deep need inspire your prayers?
- 3 The message discusses moving prayer" out of the desert of dry duty and into the glorious greenhouse of grace.' What practical steps can make prayer seem less like a duty?
- 4 Who is knocking on our church's door over, and over, again? How are we responding to them with the same grace that God gives us?

Readings for this day

Hosea 1:2-10 Hosea develops the analogy of his marriage to a prostitute and Israel's marriage to God. Israel has been unfaithful; God declares that Israel's children are not God's children. God will not save them in the onslaught that is to come.

Psalm 85 God is angry, and the people ask to return to God's favour. They remind God of all the things God has done in the past and pray that those times will come again.

Colossians 2:6-15 Through his death, Christ cleansed us from our sins. Paul reminds us that through our baptism we have been raised with Christ. He urges them to remain faithful.
