Isaiah 1:1, 10-20 While holding out the possibility of forgiveness, God sees a people whose violence and unjust actions give lie to their empty worship.

Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16 What does it mean to live by faith? After presenting us with a definition of faith- things hoped for but not seen- the author presents us with portraits of those who lived faithful lives.
