Luke 19:1-10 In Habakkuk God tells the prophet to station himself on the rampart. Zacchaeus, a wealthy social outcast, stationed himself where he could see Jesus. Jesus invites himself to dinner and Zaccaeus divested himself of wealth gained at the expense of others.

Psalm 119:137-144 In the midst of troubles and anguish, God's reliable promises and guiding commandments are our delight.

2 Thessalonians 1:1-4, 11-12 the author praises the Thessalonians for their steadfastness and faith during their persecutions and afflictions.
