Psalm 23 This psalm reflects complete trust in God. This trust is based on the psalmist's experience of God's will and capacity to be always present and leading, to provide absolute serenity and protection.

Ephesians 5: 8-14 This passage is in exhortation to an already converted audience to keep living into its conversion. Believers are to live ethically in the light and to be light.

John 9:1-41 In addition to reporting a miraculous healing, the story of the man born blind shows that Jesus, the world's light, simultaneously enlightens those wanting sight and confounds those who think they can see.
