Discussion Starters

1. What idea(s) did you find new or helpful for thinking about Easter?
2. When have you needed (or experienced) 'deep hope' in difficult times?
3. What are some ways our church helps (or could help) people in 'deep hope'?
4. Where does our community get hope, right now, and how can we support that?

Readings for this day

Isaiah 50:4-9a The servants of God - in contrast to the people described in verses 1-3 - listen for God's word, obeys God, and trusts in God's help and vindication even in face of contention and disgrace.

Psalm 118 The portion of the psalm describes a bleak and overwhelming accumulation of grief, distress, isolation, and disgrace. And yet the psalmist trusts in God's grace and deliverance declaring, "my future is in your hands."

Phillipians 2: 5-11 This passage extols the nature of Jesus' obedient self-effacement and death and celebrates the reversal wrought by God's exaltation. This story is also an exhortation to us: let Christ's mind of humble obedience be *your* mind, our mind.
