Discussion Starters

Readings for this day

Exodus 17:1-7 In the wilderness the Israelites ask Moses for water and he brings it forth from a rock. Moses reveals the people are really anxious about their faith.

Psalm 95 After first person plural imperatives ("Let's...!") to extol and praise God, the psalm switches to divine warning against testing God.

Romans 5: 1-11 Paul expounds one aspect of theodicy: suffering -- he seems to mean suffering in discipleship -- can be the means for which hope is produced.
